This man is **building**.




This girl is **hopping**.

Can you add **-er** to the end of these verbs to say who these people are?




This man is painting.






Can you fill in the missing words to complete these sentences? You either need to change the word ending **-ed** to **-ing**, or **-ing** to **-ed**.


I **watched** TV with my dad. → I am **watching** TV with my dad.

The girls **fished** in the river. → The girls were **fishing** in the river.



Show answers
