

This week we will be learning more about money. The work is at two levels again – orange if you feel you need lots of practise and green if you are confident with money problems.

How many different ways can you make £1.00? If you have real coins, then you can do this and write it as an equation eg $20p + 20p + 10p + 50p = £1.00$. I have put a sheet of coins in resources that you can cut and paste if you have a printer or you can make your own.

Work out the change from £5.00 worksheet. Print or copy onto paper to complete the calculations. You can use formal methods to subtract from £5.00 or you could use a number line.

What coins would you use to pay for the items on the sheet? Is there more than one way of making the amounts? How many different ways can you find for each item? Worksheet in resources, but you could build your own shop using your toys and labelling them with different prices.

Work out the change from £10.00. This is just like yesterday's work but with a larger amount of money. Use the same methods that you used yesterday.

Work out the price of the object in the different shopping baskets. Look at the value of each coin and then add them together to find out the cost of everything together. Wednesday orange worksheet.

Solve the real life money problems on the sheet in resources. In the café.

Work out the totals on the money work sheet by adding. You can use formal methods or real coins or your cut out coins from Monday. Extension – what change would you get from £1.00 if you bought these items.

Either print or copy out the problems from the arithmetic sheet and complete the money problems.

Make your own shop with toys or objects from around the house. Decide on the price of each object and work out what it will cost to buy two of these items. Can you add three of them together? Maybe you could get someone to play shops with you.

This is a real challenge today because it is problem solving using fractions and money. You will need to read it really carefully. I have included an answer sheet with this piece of work, but don't peep before you have a go at the sheet first.

We have written letters for you to read. There is one from Miss Hall, one from Mrs Hoque and one from Miss Pardoe. We would like you to send us a letter back telling us what you have been up to. This does not have to be about work because we have seen lots of that on Evidence Me, so it could be about all the other exciting things that you have been doing. You can use our letters as a model for writing your own letters. We look forward to reading them.
